WHEREAS: There are established connections between problem gambling and other addictions and

suicide; and

WHEREAS: Thousands of Oregonians have successfully sought free counseling and treatment, are in

recovery, and have benefited from the expertise of professionals in the behavioral health

field; and

WHEREAS: Oregonians are encouraged to not only recognize the signs of gambling disorders, but to

reach out and support friends and family members struggling with problem gambling with a

message of help and hope.
